Leading for School Improvement Institute

The Leading for School Improvement Institute provides customized support to school leaders to improve school performance. Participants engage in a yearlong, job-embedded professional learning experience grounded in effective practices for school improvement. School leaders are provided Leadership coaches to support application of effective practices for school improvement. Indepth training is provided on identifying needs, data-informed decision making, improving student outcomes, engaging the community, and transforming instruction and school culture. Participants function as a community of practice led by leadership coaches to support the continuous improvement cycle.

School leaders are selected to participate based on school performance. Any school identified for comprehensive support and improvement will be required to participate in the Leading for School Improvement Institute. Participants attend state-wide convenings quarterly for in-depth professional learning experiences and the opportunity to engage with other comprehensive support and improvement school leaders as a community of practice. **Resources and materials** from the leading for school improvement institute statewide convenings can be accessed below.




